



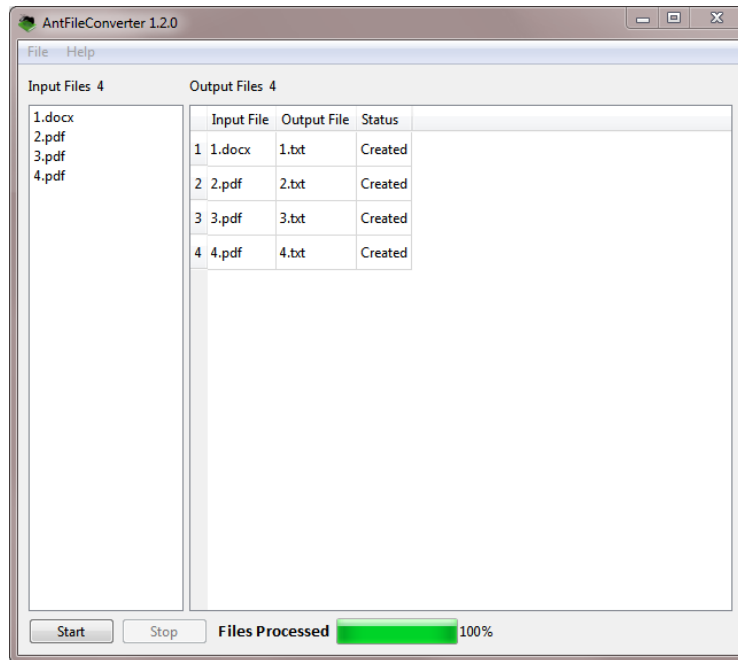

Introduction

AntFileConverter is a very easy to use freeware tool for converting PDF and Microsoft Word (.docx) files to plain text (in the UTF-8 encoding). It runs on any computer running Microsoft Windows (tested on Win 7, Win 10) and Macintosh OS X computers (tested on OS X 10.9 Mavericks). It is developed in Python and Qt using the *PyInstaller* compiler to generate executables for the different operating systems.

Getting Started

Windows

On Windows systems, simply double click the *AntFileConverter* icon and this will launch the program.

Macintosh OS X

On Macintosh systems, simply double click the *TagAnt* zip file. The zip file will unzip the *TagAnt* application. Then, you can drag the *TagAnt* application to your application folder, your desktop, or anywhere else you like. Throw away the zip file when you are finished.

Step-By-Step Guide

Step 1: Load your original files into *AntFileConverter* via the "Open File" or "Open Dir" File Menu. You can also drag and drop files into the "Original Files" list directly. Only files with a ".pdf/.PDF" or (".docx/.DOCX") extension will be listed regardless of what files or directories you select or attempt to drag and drop on to the list.

Step 2: Click the Start button and wait for the files to be converted. The converted files will be saved in the same directory(s) as the original files with the same name but with the ".txt" extension added.

Loaded files can be removed from the list by choose the "Close Files" menu option. You can stop the conversion process at any time by pressing the "Stop" button.

Note that the APA instructions are not entirely clear about citing software, and it is debatable whether or not the "Available from ..." statement is needed. See here for more details:
